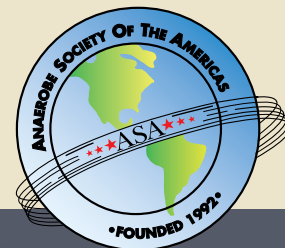

## Abstract Submission

The presenting author should submit the abstract. The presenting author needs to provide the contact information on the *Abstract Submission Form* and indicate a preference of oral or poster presentation. Communications will be made with the presenting author only.

Accepted abstracts will be assigned as oral presentations (limited to 10 minutes) or poster presentations (presentation format will be detailed on acceptance). By submitting an abstract, the presenting author agrees that, if accepted, the paper will be presented as assigned.

## Abstract Format

Abstracts must be in English and will be published exactly in the form and condition submitted by author. Abstracts are limited to 2400 characters including spaces, title and authors—Text only, no tables or figures.

The header should include (1) the entire title capitalized—do not use abbreviations; (2) authors listed as surname followed by first and middle initials, with an asterisk after the presenting author's name (outside punctuation); and (3) affiliation, stating institution, city, state/province, and country (if authors are from multiple institutions, use superscripted numbers to indicate authors' affiliations). Separate the title from the authors with a blank line; separate affiliation from the text with a blank line. See sample on the Abstract Submission Form below.

Abstracts should include the following:

- ◆ A statement of the purpose (preferably one sentence).
- ◆ Summary of methods and results (presented in sufficient detail to support the conclusion). Do not include tables or figures in abstracts, though they are encouraged in presentations and posters.
- ◆ Statement of conclusion reached, supported by results.

## Guidelines for Submission

All abstracts must be submitted in English in WORD Format as an attachment to an email sent to:

asa@anaerobe.org

The first page of the submission should include all the information requested on the Abstract Submission Form (below). Multiple abstracts can be submitted on separate pages of the document. Abstracts are limited to 2400 characters (text only), including spaces, title, and authors.

## Abstract Deadline

The deadline for Oral Abstract Presentation is December 15, 2019. Notice of acceptance will be emailed to the submitting author by February 1, 2020. Abstracts not accepted for Oral Presentation will be assigned to Poster Presentations.

The deadline for Poster Presentations is February 1, 2020. Notice of acceptance will be emailed to submitting author by March 1, 2020.

## Acceptance Awards

Abstracts accepted for Oral Presentation will have the basic registration fee (dinner ticket excluded) waived for the presenter (one presenter per accepted paper).

Best Abstract will be selected from among the Poster Presentations and awarded the *Finergold Award*, to be announced at the Congress Banquet.

## Young Investigator's Awards

Graduate and Undergraduate Students are encouraged to enter the *Young Investigator's Competition*. Finalists will be chosen from submitted abstracts, and poster presentations will be judged at the Congress. Finalists will be given Congress Banquet Tickets, where the winners will be announced. Cash prizes will be awarded to the top three presenters.

Depending on funding, limited *Student Registration Assistance Grants* may be available. To apply, check box on submission form and include a statement of need with abstract submission.
